How Westhampnett has changed over the years! This excerpt is taken from Vision of Britain http://w.visionofbritain.org.uk/place/9058

HAMPNETT (WEST), or WESTHAMPNETT, a parish and a district in Sussex. The parish lies 1½ mile NNW of Drayton r. station, and 1½ NE of Chichester; and it contains the hamlets of Westerton, Mandling, and

Woodcote. Post town, Chichester. Acres, 1,899. Real property, £, 898. Pop. in 185, 637; in 186, 502, Houses, 73. The manor belongs to the Duke of Richmond. West Hampnett Place is a Tudor edifice. with a modern front; was built by Richard Sackville, uncle of the first Lord Buckhurst: passed to the Duke of Richmond; and was converted by him into the West

Hampnett Work-house. ...

There was even a hospital, St. Mary Magdalen of Loddesdown was situated at 'Maudlins' Farm in West Hampnett; . It was originally a house for lepers; a bequest made in 1404 by John Tregoz 'for the maintenance of the poor in the hospital of St. Mary Magdalen, on the way to Chichester' to 'the poor of Loddesdowne' as late as 1418.

Chair's report

The future of Westhampnett village separated from Chichester by open countryside now lies in the hands of a government inspector. The Parish Council had consistently and robustly opposed any development on either side of Madgwick Lane rather argued that sites within the existing settlements of the parish could accommodate housing numbers required by the CDC local plan. A huge amount of time and effort has been put into the Parish Council's opposition to this proposed development along with the professional services of Bob Hull from Henry Adams, who has advised and acted on our behalf at meetings and inquiries. More recently Goodwood and

Rolls Royce have also voiced their outright hostilit y to the proposed plans.

The Parish Council has been in protracted discussions with Southern Water concerning the flooding and sewage problems within our community. We

have been informed by Southern Water

that details a major investment to are to be announced shortly. We are hopeful that this will solve the problems experienced in past years. The parish council's perseverance in establishing a 30mph through the village and Madgwick lane has finally paid off, the illuminated sign

are unable to be reprogrammed and have to be completely replaced. This will be done in due course

Nature Notes

The old land fill site that lies to the east of Coach Road has a new management plan worked out between the WSCC and the Parish council. Skylarks have been nesting there for some years and its been difficult to accommodate their requirements and the grassland management needed to sustain the soil structure. Last year's very wet winter didn't help the situation as the clay capping is impossible to get on with heavy machinery and large stones work their way to the surface and if the ground is not rolled would damage mowing equipment later in the year. There are weeds such as docks, fat hen and ragwort that need to be controlled with selective weed killers and

chain harrowing to keep the sward healthy.

using suitable equipment this should be able to be achieved. during May June and most of July no cultivations will take place there by allowing the skylarks to raise two broods be-

fore a crop of hay is taken. if further spraying and rolling it will be done in September and sheep will be brought in to graze over the winter, they also consolidate the soil without damaging the structure as cattle would do in a wet winter. We are being allowed to survey the site for numbers of birds and in what areas of the field they are nesting.

Hopefully this management scheme will act as a format for other WSCC sites


